LBMS – A New “Bell Free” School

Chances are your son or daughter has already told you - it's awfully quiet at the Luther Burbank Middle School! That's because we have made the school-wide decision to transition to a bell-free school. The reason for this is both philosophical and logistical. Philosophically, the move away from bells takes us one step closer to a more progressive middle school scheduling model, one that includes advisory, supports interdisciplinary team-teaching, and paves the way for project-based learning. Not to mention, without the sounds of those 16+ bells ringing throughout the day, LBMS is just a more welcoming place! Logistically speaking, our bell system was outdated. The system was just not smart enough to adapt to the needs of our new schedule with the addition of our new technology class, Innovation Lab, for grades 6 and 7 and our school-wide advisory program beginning in October. So far, our teachers and students have done an excellent job of adjusting to this new (quieter) way of school life.

1:1 Chromebooks

Our 8th graders will receive their 1:1 Chromebooks today, Tuesday. This year marks the second year of the Chromebook initiative. The 1:1 initiative presents learning possibilities for our teachers and students that have never before been possible. A personal mobile device offers students anytime, anywhere access to rich educational resources and 21st century learning experiences that align with the Massachusetts curriculum frameworks. Consistent access to a mobile device ensures that students are provided opportunities to use technology to create, collaborate, communicate and think critically. A 1:1 model enables teachers to regularly guide students in the ethical and safe use of technology and to use digital resources to personalize and self-direct learning. This digital learning model promotes equitable access to curriculum, differentiation of instruction and independent discovery.
