This Week in U.S. History By Mr. Van Ewyk

History 3 - This week students transition from the colonies to the revolution. He will focus on the "stepping stones on the pathway to American republicanism," including the VA House of Burgesses, New England town hall meetings, escaping European religious persecution, and the desire for self-determination.

History 4 -

This week students will learn about the independence of Texas and the Mexican War. We will make connections between western expansion and the question of the expansion of slavery to these new territories and states. We will begin examining the causes of the US Civil War.

Substitute Teacher for Math Course 1



In the Classroom, by Mr. Gaumont

This week in History 3, Mr. Gaumont's students put their critical thinking skills to the test when they evaluated John Adams' defense of the British soldiers involved in the Boston Massacre. Students wrote an essay drawing comparisons between John Adams' actions and The Founders Academy Code of Conduct. Students concluded that Adams showed courage and open-mindedness by taking the case. He showed lawfulness and determination, despite the pressure placed on him by his peers, including his cousin Samuel Adams. Many students expressed their admiration for Adams and reflected on how they can display some of these same character traits in their own lives.
