Hayride Thank You

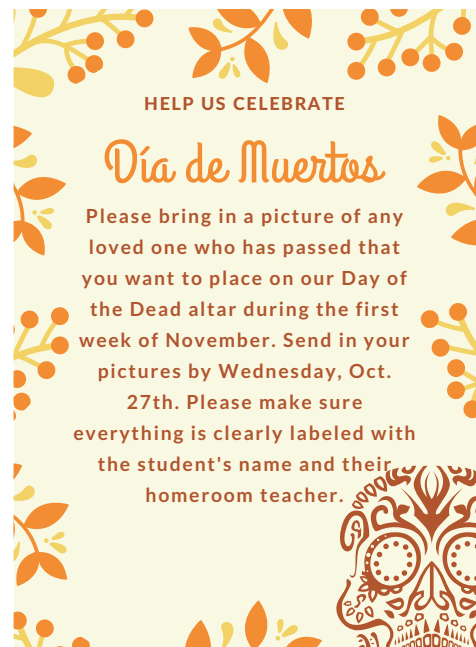
Thank you to Todd and Amy LaJoy for organizing our annual Hayride and Bonfire at Three Cedars Farm on October 8.

Classroom Happenings



Mrs. Nicholas' 4th grade science classes used toy cars to demonstrate how energy is transferred from one vehicle to another in a collision. The students replicated car crashes using the toy cars to see how far the second vehicle would travel upon impact from the first vehicle. Some toy cars also had nickels taped to their roofs to simulate weighed versus nonweighed vehicles. Using yardsticks, the students measured the distance the stationary vehicle travelled when hit.



Mrs. Cam's/Mrs. Button's 2nd grade class celebrated Chinese Lunar New Year on Friday as they finished their unit on Early Asian Civilizations. Although Lunar New Year actually happens in January or February each year, our 2nd graders had the chance to enjoy activities early! Scholastic Book Fair Is Coming In-Person October 25-29

We are just a week away from our first in-person book fair since the fall of 2019. As I mentioned in last week's newsletter, there will be a few changes to keep everyone safe. Hand sanitizer will be at the door and each person will use it upon entering the library. I have also scheduled 15 minutes between classes to allow time to wipe down frequently touched surfaces.

There is another added safety feature that Scholastic is offering and that is their eWallet account. This account will allow you to set the amount you would like your child to spend at the book fair without the hassle of sending money to school and hoping it gets there safely. This account also eliminates any need for money to be exchanged. If you have used eWallet in the past please note that if there is a balance left in your account at the end of the book fair, you can use it to make online purchases at the Scholastic Store or the balance will carry over to the spring book fair. Of course, cash and checks made out to All Saints Catholic School will be accepted during the fair.



Unfortunately one change to the fall book fair is that there will be no parent volunteers. Please ignore the volunteer sign-up on the book fair homepage. I will truly miss the help, but I am keeping my fingers crossed for the spring book fair.

All Saints Welcomes the Return of Parents in Prayer on November 12

Parents in Prayer is returning to the All Saints campus, on Friday mornings, beginning November 12.

This is great news because as Christians we believe in the power of prayer. We know and trust that God hears our prayers; therefore, our intercession is pivotal to receive the grace, power, and love that God wants to give our All Saints community-- students, parents, teachers, administration, and clergy.

During the week, our teachers will ask for students to write their prayer intentions for others and petitions for themselves and then place them in their class prayer basket. On Friday mornings, parents are invited to come to the chapel to privately read and pray for their child's classmates' prayers. Once all the prayers have been read and placed in front of the altar, we will ask for our Blessed Mother's intercession by praying the rosary.

We are asking for parents to come and pray at least one time during the school year for their child's class. If a parent cannot make it, you may have a grandparent, other family member, or friend come for you. We will not be using the Sign Up Genius this year, just come when you can.

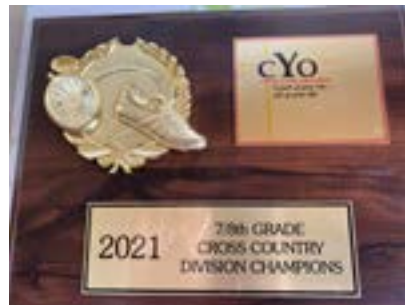

JUNIOR AMERICAN CITIZENS COMMITTEE CONTEST GUIDELINES FOR TEACHERS/LEADERS

**2021–2022 Theme: “The 100th Anniversary of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier:
Rise and Shine for Duty, Honor and Patriotism”**

The National Society Daughters of the American Revolution created the Junior American Citizens (JAC) Committee to promote good citizenship and appreciation of American heritage and history among every school-age child in the United States. The JAC Committee offers contests in art, creative expression, and community service. This packet contains instructions for entering JAC Contests.

JAC CONTEST RULES

Contests are conducted without regard to gender, race, color, religion, or national origin. All children in pre-school through grade 12 are encouraged to participate; however, pre-school and kindergarten students may participate only in the banner and group community service project categories. Youth groups such as scout troops, C.A.R. societies, and service organizations, as well as schools, may participate in the contests. Entries are judged by grade on three levels (gifted, general and special needs) so that every child may enter the contest regardless of ability. This information is carefully guarded and no certificate or award medal will indicate a specific level. Do not submit a student photograph with the entry.

All entries except community service **must** follow the theme “**The 100th Anniversary of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier: Rise and Shine for Duty, Honor and Patriotism**” and meet the specifications of the category entered. Each entry must have a legible, fully completed entry form securely attached to the reverse side. Group entries are accepted in the banner and community service categories only. A group must have three (3) to five (5) in the banner category only. In the community service category, a group is composed of more than three (3) members. All members of a group should be listed with their individual grade.

JUNIOR AMERICAN CITIZENS COMMITTEE CONTEST CATEGORIES

**2021-2022 Theme: “The 100th Anniversary of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier:
Rise and Shine for Duty, Honor and Patriotism”**

ART CONTEST

- **Poster:** **Individual entry.** Grades 1-12 – Design a poster using the theme. **Original art work only, not from other sources.** Minimum size: 8-1/2" x 11" Maximum size 22" x 28". Poster may be laminated or placed in a protective sleeve.
- **Stamp Design:** **Individual entry.** Grades 1-12 – Design a postal stamp using the theme. **Original art work only.** Exact size: 5" x 7" drawn in the center of an 8-1/2" x 11" sheet of white paper. The paper should be white because the vast majority of envelopes are white, thus the stamp design is viewed in the way it would actually be used. Designs may be laminated or placed in a protective sleeve, but not in folders.
- **Photo Essay:** **Individual entry.** Grades 1-12 – The student will submit not more than 25 color photographs illustrating the theme. These photos must be the original photos **taken by the child.** The photos should be mounted with glue on 8-1/2" x 11" paper and bound in a three-brad composition folder. Brief captions may appear on each page. Include a title page. Remember, this is an ART contest, your pictures should tell the story.
- **Banner:** **Groups of three (3) to five (5) only, Pre-K through Grade 12.** Design an original banner using the theme. Size: Use a 1:3 ratio, to a maximum size of 16" x 48". Banners may be paper or fabric. If the banner has support rods, do not submit them. Objects attached to banners should be glued or sewn on securely. For the safety of the judges, do not use straight or safety pins.

CREATIVE EXPRESSION CONTEST

- **Poem:** **Individual entry.** Grades 1-12 – Write an original poem, any style, of 300 words or fewer. Entries should be on 8-1/2" x 11" paper, either ruled or plain. Poems may be placed in a plastic sleeve for protection.
- **Short Story:** **Individual entry.** Grades 1-12 – Write an original short story of 500 words or fewer. The story may be written from the first person or third person point of view. * Entries should be on 8-1/2" x 11" paper, either ruled or plain. Short stories may be placed in a plastic sleeve for protection.

* While a short story may contain historical places and people, it is a work of fiction. It is not a report.

COMMUNITY SERVICE CONTEST

- **Community Service:** **Individual entry or group of three (3) or more members Pre-K through Grade 12.** Groups may be mixed ages. Entries should consist of no more than 15 color photographs with a descriptive text of 500 words or fewer. Identify all photographs with captions. Entries should be placed in a three-brad composition folder.

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
