Scholarships

Detailed information is available in the College & Career Center. Unless otherwise noted, this information is for Seniors.

Leadership/Community Service/Academics/Athletics:

The Monroe Professional Engineers Society (MPES) is the local Chapter of the National Chapter of the National Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE) and distribute scholarships for graduating seniors who plan to study Engineering at an ABET accredited college starting in the Fall of 2023. Minimum criteria is 600/500 Math/Verbal SAT score or 29/25 Math/English ACT score and 85 or 3.0 GPA. Average scholarship is \$2,000. **Deadline: December 23, 2022.**

St. John Fisher University recognizes and rewards high school seniors who demonstrated an ongoing interest in serving the needs of other through commitment to community service. Apply to St. John Fisher College and complete the online application at: go.sjf.edu/scholarships.

The Fannie and Sam Constantino First Generation Scholarship Program is designed to provide financial and academic assistance to high school students who exhibit a high degree of motivation and academic potential, and whose parents did not graduate from a post-secondary institution. Apply to St. John Fisher College and complete the online application at: go.sjf.edu/scholarships.

Polly F. Burke Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship was established by the family and friends of Polly F. Burke. Mrs. Burke was active in the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR). The scholarship may vary but is expected to be about \$1,000.00. Applicants must be a U.S. citizen, senior or graduate of a Monroe County high school, enrolled or plan to attend a institute of higher learning. 2023 GE-Regan Foundation Scholarship Program. This national program awards college scholarships to high school seniors who

Applicants must excel academically, exhibit exceptional leadership potential, participate in community service activities and demonstrate financial need. **January 9th deadline** to be considered for the Ron Brown Program only. The Polish Heritage Society of Rochester is awarding a \$4,000 scholarship to up to ten qualifying high school seniors. Career Specific:

The Monroe Professional Engineers Society, the local chapter of the National Society of Professional Engineers, is offering scholarships to graduating high school seniors who plan to study engineering at an ABET accredited college starting in the Fall of 2023. Minimum SAT criteria is 600 on the math portion and 500 on the verbal. Minimum ACT criteria is 29 on the math portion and 25 on the English. Must have a 3.0 GPA or 85 average. IMPORTANT TEST INFORMATION

The National Achievement Scholarship Program, conducted by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation, is a privately financed competition established to provide recognition for outstanding Black American high school students. Black American students may enter both of NMSC's competitions for recognition and awards by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT). However, entry to the National Achievement Program must be specifically requested on the test answer sheet.

SAT deadline - February 10th for the March 11th Test
Register online at www.collegeboard.com

ACT deadline - March 10th for the April 15th test
Register online at www.actstudent.org

Stop into the College & Career Center to pick up registration packets and preparation booklets.

The College Board has introduced important changes for registration for SAT testing for Test Security.

The College Board requires:

- You will be prompted to provide an **acceptable photo** during registration. The photo will appear on your Admission Ticket.
- You must present your Admission Ticket with your acceptable photo ID to enter your test center. **No ticket, no ID, no admission!**
- Standby test-takers will not be admitted. (Online requests for **waitlist status may be possible** until about five days before the test.)

- **Changes** to test center, test date or test type **will not be permitted on test day**. They will have to be submitted about two prior to test day.

Admission Ticket Photo Guidelines:

- You are responsible for providing an acceptable photo when you register. To be acceptable, it must:
- Be clear, properly focused and correctly exposed
- Be taken in full-face view, directly facing the camera
- Match how you will look on the day of the test and in your photo ID
- School or government issued
- Original and valid (unexpired)
- In good condition and exactly matching the information you provided at registration.

You will be turned away if your photo does not meet the requirements.

These guidelines are just some of the points you need to know. Be sure to carefully review the complete list of photo and identification requirements given online at sat.org/test-day or in the Paper Registration Guide.
