 - Minimal cost to families



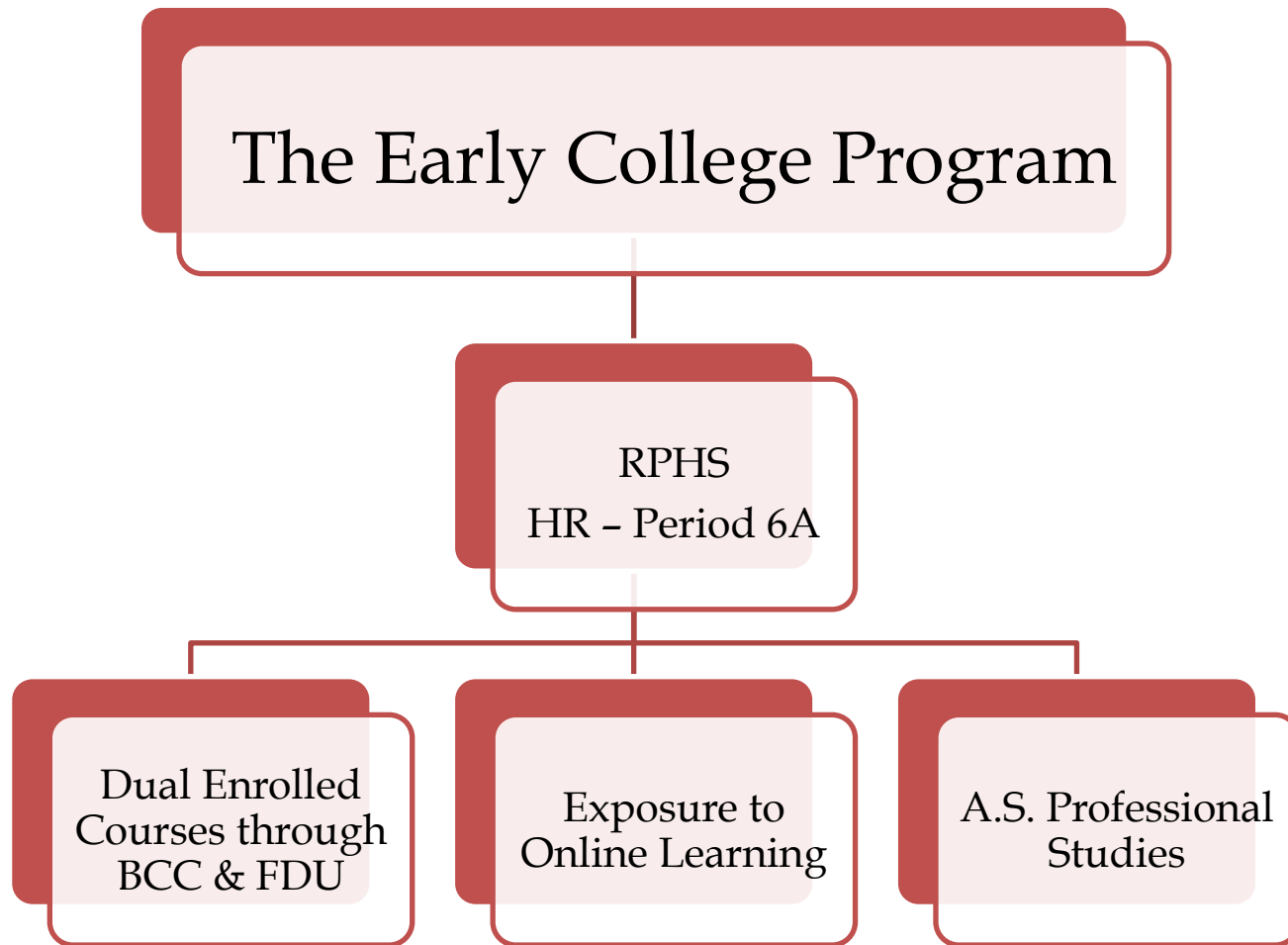
The Early College Program

The Early College Program

Testing Requirements

- Fulfill BCC Testing Requirement: Next Generation Accuplacer Test
Passing score for Arithmetic is 264.
Passing score for Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics is 264.
Passing scores for English Basic Skills (EBS) are 6 or higher on the essay AND 243-300 on Reading.
The highest score on any of the multiple-choice tests is 300.
The highest score on the essay is 8.

OR

- Achieve the following minimum score on the SAT
Math 500
Reading 500

Scores must be provided to Mrs. Hasselberger

Vaccination Requirement

- In order to take classes on campus, a student must be vaccinated or agree to weekly testing.
- Once a student is accepted into the program, there will be instructions on where to upload proof of vaccination or weekly test results.

The Early College Program

Design

Accepted students complete program requirements for:

- A.S. Professional Studies (60 credits)

Mornings at RPJSHS

- Homeroom
- Periods 2, 3, 4, 5A, 6A
- Lunch

Afternoons at BCC

- One class Monday/Wednesday
- One class Tuesday/Thursday
- One class Friday (online) OR can be a asynchronous class throughout the semester



How is 60 credits possible?

In order to achieve the 60 credits required for the degree, students need to take some of our Dual Enrollment courses which satisfy requirements of the degree program.

We offer 18 dual enrollment courses through BCC and FDU.

Dual enrollment registration and payment is the responsibility of the student/family.

Additionally, students will have to take Summer I and possibly Summer II courses.

Cost to Families

- BCC charges $\frac{1}{2}$ tuition to all students enrolled in the Early College Program.
- RP BOE will pay $\frac{1}{2}$ of the semester tuition.
For example: Current students are taking 10 credits totaling \$1430.25. However, RP will pay half, so they are only responsible for \$715.13 plus the cost of books.
- Families are responsible for the cost of all dual enrolled courses (approximately \$225 per course).
- Families are responsible for the cost of books.
- Transportation is provided by RP BOE.



What does the research say?



Students who participate in Early College Programs...

- Are more likely to attain a college degree
- Have greater access to college and greater enrollment
- Have greater academic achievement in high school

Common Questions...

- Will transportation be provided?
- If RP schools are closed but BCC is open, does the student still attend class at BCC?
- Can students still be involved in extra-curricular activities and sports at RP?
- Are parents responsible for the registration and cost of dual enrollment credits?
- Who pays for the books needed for the BCC courses?
- Can a student drop from the ECA and resume a normal schedule at RPHS?



What Next?

- Students should plan to meet with me for an informal meeting.
- Interested students will be given a consent form explaining the entry requirements, program outline and financial responsibilities.
- The consent form must be signed by a parent and returned to me.
- Students will prepare for and schedule their own placement test at BCC.
- The cut off for testing is March 31, 2022.
